Since finishing her work with former Ward 6 Councilmember Tommy Wells, Bonnie has been delighted to design activities for the Village such as walking groups, happy hours and game nights and coffee hangouts.

Bonnie moved to Mount Pleasant in 1980 with her husband Frank Method. From their Lamont Street home, she was a consultant in international education, building on her service as a Peace Corps Volunteer in Honduras, and extending to projects in Central and South

America and Southern Africa. However, the pull of local politics and the joys of raising son Joseph led her to stop extensive international travel. She published the *Mount Pleasant Bulletin Board* and later worked with the DC Board of Education, several councilmembers, and the District government.

Prior to the Peace Corps, Bonnie worked with the U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare's Office for Civil Rights, conducting compliance reviews of U.S. school systems. She was transferred here from Chicago to work on national-origin civil rights cases.

Bonnie received MA and D.Ed degrees in international education from the University of Massachusetts Amherst. She chairs the Multicultural Community Service, a local NGO that promotes civic engagement and provides oral interpretation and translation services for the region's immigrants. In her spare time, she sings with the Encore Rock Chorale. She will soon begin renovating her home to support aging in place and is exploring co-housing options. Her husband Frank died in 2013 and son Joseph lives in Massachusetts.

New Editor of the Mount Pleasant Village Newsletter, Larry Rickards

This issue marks the debut of Lawrence "Larry" Rickards as the Village Newsletter editor. A California native, Larry moved to New York after college, then to the DC area for a doctorate in counseling at the University of Maryland. Larry has been a Mt. Pleasant resident since his marriage to Cynthia "Tia" Pratt in 1983. His first DC job was in legislative affairs, working on the implementation of the mental health recommendations of the 1981 White House Conference on Aging.

Larry retired from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services nine years ago, after overseeing programs for persons experiencing



homelessness and those with co-occurring mental and substance abuse disorders. Larry enjoys traveling (he and Tia were in Tanzania and South Africa in August), photography, writing, meditation and family genealogy. Flying Fish coffee shop will exhibit his photos in June. He is delighted to volunteer on behalf of the Village.

Urban Farmers Convene to Discuss the Joys and Possibilities of Gardening

The first meeting of the Urban Farming interest group was held January 20 for members ranging from "first timers" to "rural farm owners." The group discussed planting dates for DC; recommended planting combinations; promoting plant pollinators with flower seeds provided by the DC government; soil testing for ph and soil contaminants and nutrients; compost sources and production methods; seed sources, and tree pruning contractors who can help open up more sun to shaded gardens. Partnerships and Opportunities: Iona Senior Services and DC Office on Aging

The Village recently formalized partnerships with two major senior organizations to provide expanded opportunities and services for Village members.

Iona Senior Services, a 40-year-old nonprofit agency provides Village members access to and discounts on a number of its services, educational and advocacy programs at 4125 Albemarle St. NW in Tenleytown. Some Iona services may be covered by Medicare or health insurance.

- Each Village member will receive free Iona's 272-page **Resource Guide** to local retirement planning, home health care and agencies, nutrition and ombudsman services, housing, etc.
- Village members will receive a 17% discount on Iona's usual \$145 fee for its Take
 Charge/Age Well Academy's 8-workshop series on such topics as physical and mental wellness, critical decision-making, and planning for the future.
- Villagers get similar discounts for Iona's **professional care management** and consultations.
- Iona sponsors many additional workshops and events for which donations are requested. To learn about these, sign up for e-mail alerts at https://www.iona.org/email-sign-up.html.
- Villagers may participate in Iona's **Wellness & Arts** program for older adults living with memory loss or physical disabilities. This medically supervised daily program costs \$104.50 per day, often subsidized by Medicare, private insurance or Iona low-income scholarships.
- Village leaders receive free or discounted training on organizational issues, in-home assessments and consultations for addressing challenging eldercare situations. Iona will refer eligible individuals to join the Mount Pleasant Village if they live in our area.
- The Village may participate in several advocacy coalitions led by Iona that work to expand and improve aging services and long-term care options and address other aging issues.
