Meet the Villagers: Cynthia (Tia) Pratt, Village Volunteer



Tia Pratt was born in Providence and grew up in rural Rhode Island in a pre-Revolutionary War house. Her closest playmates were the landlord's horses and the butterflies in the meadows. She moved to the District in 1963 to attend George Washington University, graduating with a degree in art, and purchased her Hobart Street home in 1975. Obtaining a home loan was challenging as banks, at the time, were reluctant to lend to single women and had illegally red-lined the neighborhood.

She worked for several years as a graphic artist for Hahn shoes (at 7th & K Streets), and was in the thick of the 1968 riots. In 1972, she began work in association management – with the National Association of Social Workers and American Consulting Engineers Council, among others. Long before retirement, Tia was a community volunteer, first with efforts to save the Old Post Office, then with Mt. Pleasant Main Street and Historic Mt. Pleasant. For several years, she was Main Street's one-woman graffiti-removal force and organized the planting and maintenance of liriope in the Mt. Pleasant Street tree-boxes. Tia currently volunteers with the Washington Lawyers Committee for Civil Rights and Urban Affairs, and delivers meals for Food and Friends.

Tia and husband Lawrence Rickards are avid travelers, having visited Cuba and numerous countries in Europe, Africa, and South America. This fall they will visit China, Tibet and Cambodia.

Mount Pleasant Village Joins the Social Isolation Project: Seeks Volunteers

Social isolation is a prevalent health concern for older adults living in the community, negatively impacting their health, well-being, and quality of life. Winston Scott and the Hidden History of the CIA; CIA & JFK: The Secret Assassination Files; Trained to Kill: The Inside Story of CIA Plots Against Castro, Kennedy, and Che; The Ghost: The Secret Life of CIA Spymaster James Jesus Angleton; and with Lawrence A. Stanley, RAP: The Lyrics.

Upcoming Village Event: Adapting Your Home for Aging in Place

Most of us want to stay in the home and neighborhood we love. Our changing ability to perform everyday tasks can make it difficult, but adaptations, large and small, may make it work. The Village is sponsoring a two-part program to walk us through design and remodeling options specific to our Mt. Pleasant homes.

- In Part I: Universal Design 101, to be held Tuesday, May 16, 1-3 pm, at the Mt. Pleasant Library, Jeffrey M. Stoiber, from Stoiber & Associates, will discuss design features that can make homes safe and comfortable regardless of age or ability level.
- In Part II: Adaptations for Older Homes, two small group sessions will be held in two different locations, where the presenters will describe home modifications that could be elder friendly.
 - Tuesday, May 23, 1-3 pm, at 1710 Hobart St. NW (a 1927 row house), with aging-in-place specialist Steve Hage.
 - Thursday, May 25, 1-3 pm, at 1753 Lamont St. NW (a 1907 semi-detached house), with Jeffrey M. Stoiber.
